## Kobe Bryant dies in crash

### Lakers legend, daughter and 7 others killed in helicopter accident

#### He was a talent like no other

The NBA wasn't convinced about Bryant's early path. He was undrafted.

From the very start when Kobe Bryant played his first game for the Los Angeles Lakers as an 18-year-old basketball phenom, his path to greatness seemed assured. But it would not be easy.

The NBA wasn't convinced that any player, no matter how sensational or talented, could jump directly from high school to the big leagues.

But Bryant was a different sort of player, the son of a well-to-do Philadelphia family who spent the formative years in Europe. His unusual upbringing and fiery determination — holding himself and those around him to the highest standards — sometimes led to friction with coaches and teammates.

None of that could stop the 6-foot shooting guard from becoming one of the greatest in the history of the game, equally dangerous driving to the basket or shooting from outside. None of it could dull the sense of shock that came over Los Angeles, a city that grew to love him, when he died Sunday in a helicopter crash that claimed the lives of his 4-year-old daughter, Gianna, and seven others.

"Just to see the joy he played the game with, the joy he brought to fans, was pretty remarkable," Lakers great Jerry West said. "You don't see players of that skill and that caliber that are able to do those things and bring that joy."

Magic Johnson called him "a different cat," and he was. *(Obituary, A1)*

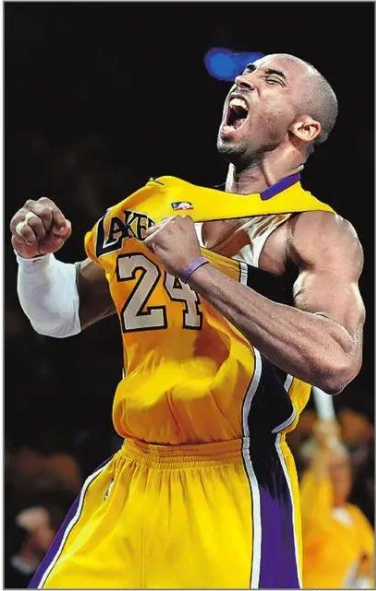

Helicopter rotor blades whirred through the haze on Sunday morning, too loud to hear. Scott Daublin was taking a smoke break while waiting up the sound at his church in Calabasas. It was 9:41 a.m. He tracked the sound in the sky toward an empty lot across Las Virgenes Road.

The helicopter hit the slope in a violent crash of metal, followed by the boom of an explosion that reverberated across the canyon — and soon enough, around the world.

Kobe Bryant, one of the greatest basketball players of all time — an 18-year-old, times-frustrating star who impressed Los Angeles with his 20 legendary years as a Lakers — was killed in the wreckage at age 41.

His 13-year-old daughter, Gianna, died alongside him, as did seven others — everyone on board. Bryant appeared to be the only one in a travel limousine. He was home with his wife, Vanessa, and three daughters — Natalia, 17, Bianka, 13, and Capri, seven months.

Officials did not release the names of the other victims, but Orange Coast College confirmed that its basketball coach, John Althoff, his wife, Kerri, and daughter, Alyssa, were among them. Christina Mauer, an assistant coach of a girls basketball team at the Manito Sports Academy, also died, her husband said on Facebook.

Los Angeles County Fire Chief David Gray said firefighters responding to a 911 call at 9:41 a.m. found a debris field in steep terrain and a quarter-mile brush fire.

Parade tractors arriving by helicopter searched the area but found no survivors. The bodies were found in Newport Beach and Los Angeles, and a helicopter chartered by Bryant's agent, Orange County's John Wayne Airport.

A Sikorsky S-76 helicopter, built in 1991, departed John Wayne at 9:30 a.m., according to publicly available flight records. The National Transportation Safety Board database shows no prior incidents or accidents for the model helicopter.

Around the city and the world, the news of Bryant's death and the crash of his helicopter ignited a firestorm of grief and mourning. Bryant, 41, was a five-time NBA champion and 18-time All-Star. ## State sees first two cases of new virus

Health officials confirmed California's first two cases of the new strain of coronavirus in Los Angeles and Orange counties Sunday, brought by travelers who came from the province of Hubei in central China.

In both counties, the virus infecting the two individuals was the same strain as the one that has spread to more than 700 people in 41 countries and territories and is suspected to have been discovered last month in central China. Three other cases have been diagnosed in the U.S., one each in Arizona, Washington and California.

In L.A. County, the infected person was a returning traveler from Wuhan who is receiving medical treatment at a hospital, officials said. *(See Coronavirus, A1)*

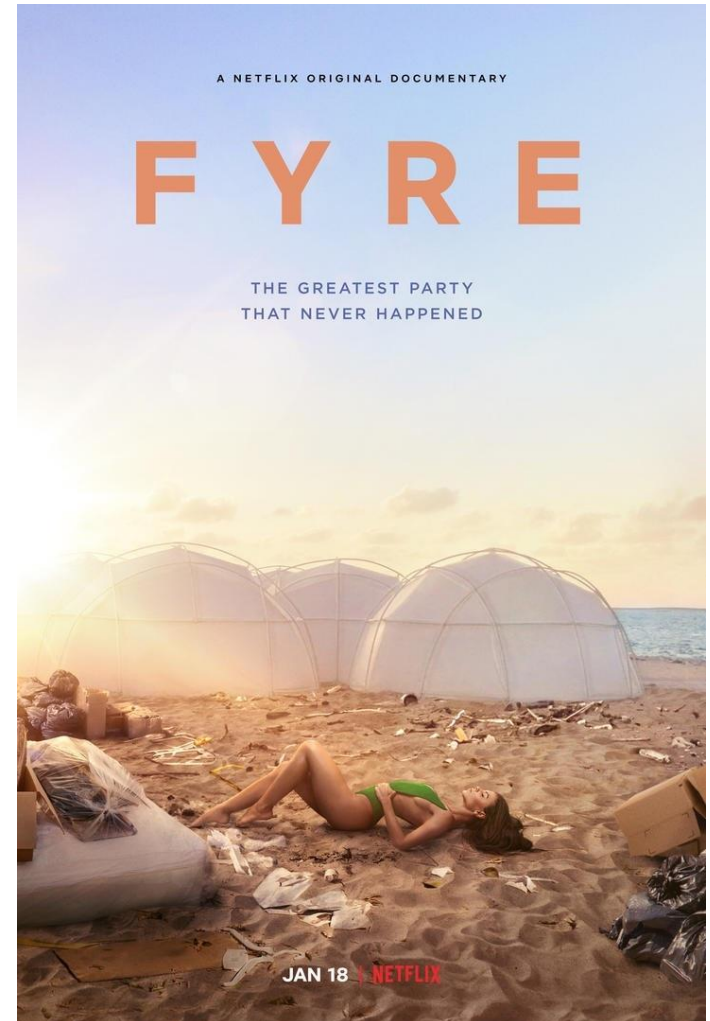
